**2014 South Jersey Youth Independent Football Association Junior High Team Division
Champions**

At this time, Mayor Carlin read the following for the record:

July 28, 2015

The Falcons were invited to play in other Junior High League Champions in the area:

- The South Jersey Elite Champions Winslow Eagles
- The Tri-County Champions Camden PAL Tigers
- The Delaware State Champions Claymont Falcons
- The Philadelphia Region Champions Parkside Saints
- The South Jersey Independent Champions Burlington Township Falcons

They finished their regular season with a 3-1 record. After an initial 20-12 loss they won their last three games by a combined score of 118-6 and earned the number 2 seed in the playoffs.

In the first round of the playoffs they again faced the Camden Pal Tigers. During the first series they lost one of their key players to a high ankle injury so they relied on their defense and air attack. Three touchdown passes later they ended up advancing to the Championship game with a 26-6 win.

In the Championship Game they faced off against the undefeated Parkside Saints who early on provided the Falcons only defeat. This game was without a doubt a complete team victory. They jumped out to a 6-0 lead on their first offensive possession and a defensive battle ensued for the rest of the half.

On the second half kick-off they were pinned inside their own 20 yard line. After a penalty and a couple plays that went for a loss, they decided to take an intentional safety on the 4th down to make the score 6-2.

With the kickoff after the safety and some solid defense they were able to turn around the field position. The third quarter ended with the score being 6-2. Parkside threatened to take the lead getting the ball inside their 20 yard line when they once again stepped up on the defensive side of the ball.

From there their offense took over. They ate up 8 minutes on the clock and took the ball 70 yards before capping off the drive with a 10 yard fade to the end zone to take a 12-2 lead with two minutes left to seal the win. In the end they won the game because they were more disciplined, they played together as a team, they had more heart, and they never gave up on each other – a complete team championship.
