PUBLIC PORTION

President Kozub opened the floor to the public for their views and comments.

LINDA VESSELS, 7 JENNIFER LANE: Mrs. Vessels stated that approximately 6 weeks ago she was at a meeting complaining about trash, rodents, mosquitoes, uncut grass, and other problems with the neighbor behind her; especially the structure on his property that is rotten and falling down. She reported that as of now no action has been taken in any of these areas and proceeded to read a letter sent out in 2009 by Mayor George quoting township ordinances regarding litter.

President Kozub asked for the address of the property.

Mrs. Vessels stated that the address is 1811 Beverly Road, property of Gordon Grieve, which was the same property she complained about 6 weeks ago.

President Kozub replied that we did pay attention to your complaint.

Mr. McLernon stated that shortly after that meeting he went out to the site with Mr. Wright, Construction Official. He stated that they received permission from an adjoining property owner to absorb the site on their property; and what they saw was Mr. Grieve mowing his lawn in the front and back. He stated that Mr. Stetz has been out with a heart problem. He has since returned and will be addressing the pool issue. He explained that they did not see any signs of rodents, piles of dirt or trash. At this time, it seems that the only issue is the pool; and that will be addressed by Mr. Stetz.

Mr. Wright reported that a letter was already sent to Mr. Grieve regarding a fence around the pool and we are waiting for a reply as this time.

Mrs. Vessels continued to complain about the structure that is falling down and asked why he did not have to get any permits for that.

Mr. Wright explained that this is not a permanent structure. It has no footings or foundation; and therefore is not permanent.

President Kozub stated that we will be getting a report back from Mr. Stetz as soon as he gets caught up on his work load.
